

# Shellow to Speak on "Informers"

James M. Shellow, criminal trial lawyer and part-time Beloit College faculty member, speaks tonight at 7:30 PM in the Student Union. Shellow's topic is "The Role of the Police Informer."

The Milwaukee lawyer is well known to Beloit students as the popular professor of last term's Advanced Sociological Analysis, a course which he focused on criminal law and psychology.

The veteran criminal lawyer serves as counsel for several nationally prominent individuals and groups. Among these are the controversial Roman Catholic Priest, Father James Groppi, adviser to the Milwaukee NAACP Youth Council; the Commandoes of the Youth Council; and Dick Gregory, comedian turned civil rights worker, and an announced Presidential candidate.

Shellow is no stranger to the university. He has a B.A. from the University of Chicago, where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He received his L.L.B. from Marquette University and is just short of another degree, a Ph.D., in psychology. In addition to this impressive list of credentials, Shellow is also a Certified Public Accountant, an experienced engineer, and a seven-year veteran of criminal law proceedings.

His appearance tonight in the Union is a presentation of the Social Board Forum Series, and is OFFICIAL.
